

Arrangements for our return trip to the Haarlem Jamborette this Summer are in full swing and planning for Lochearnhead with the initial meetings having taken place and activity teams now planning how they will deliver the slightly different format of activities in 2020.

Josh, Nate, Thomas, Becky, Ollie, Timmy and Tom are excitedly looking forward to their participation in the 2019 World Scout Jamboree in the USA, as are the numerous adults heading out as part of the volunteer service crew and UK contingent management team. Our plan to better support leaders, executive committees and event organisers is being tweaked after its first year – instead of an external "virtual assistant", we are now working with Phasels Wood to trial a new "County Support Service" and will utilise members of their staff team, as well as the facilities based at our local activity centre.

We are continuing to explore opportunities to bring additional income into the district to supplement the membership fee so that we can invest in resources to support the front line leaders deliver great Scouting despite the growing pressures of work and family life.

Policies and Targets

The District Executive Committee has been working hard to keep up with the continually evolving guidance provided by The Scout Association and the Charity Commission. During the past few years, guided by our Chairman and District Commissioner, we have implemented a number of Procedural and Financial policies within the District, and set ourselves targets for coming years. We expect these initiatives to continue.

Financial Policy and Reserves

The District maintains the following Reserves for development and unexpected expenditure: General District Reserve International Activities and Jamboree reserve District Scout Shop development reserve District Headquarters reserve

The following Policy was adopted in 2013:

"Where possible we do not want to increase Reserves or Subscriptions" (In fact for 2014 the District Subscription was reduced, and it remained unchanged for 2015. For 2016 there was a slight increase following the change to the HQ subscription model.)

These Policies are stated on the District Website.

Targets

The District's main target is to widen the provision of Scouting and increase membership locally. This is being achieved by supporting Groups to expand and extending the range of Activities provided within the District.

In 2014 we achieved our target of 1000 young members, and at the start of 2015 our youth membership was the highest ever at 1013. During 2015 this grew again to 1052, and during 2016 to 1125.

As usual, the annual census shows varying fortunes across the Scout Groups, particular congratulations go to those Scout Groups who have opened new sections or increased their numbers.

During 2019 we will continue to stabilise and strengthen existing provision, including working to improve the number of Explorer Scouts, which has dipped over the last two years.
