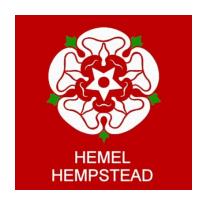


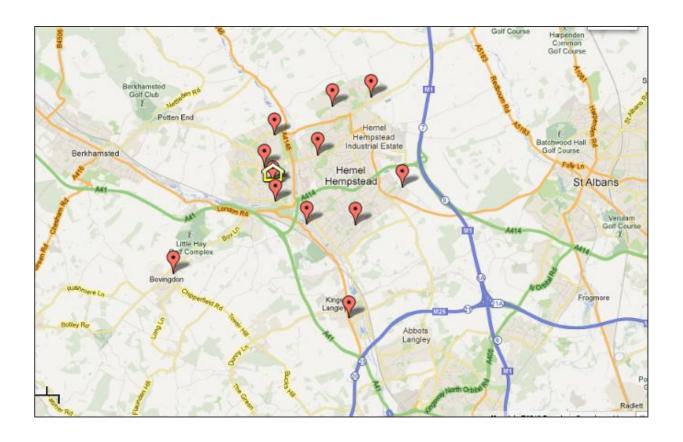

A Brief Overview of Hemel Hempstead Scout District

The function of a Scout District is to provide support and facilities for its constituent Scout Groups, in which the greatest part of Scouting activity actually takes place on a weekly basis. This District comprises thirteen Groups, all of which are very busy and will be making their own separate Reports at their own Annual Meetings. In addition, the District runs three Explorer Scout Units (for ages 14-18) and a Scout Network (18-25). Many more details of their various activities can be found on the District and individual Group websites.

The services provided by this Scout District include such topics as the Appointment and Training of Leaders, and the planning and financial management of certain major events such as an International Camp or celebration of St. George's Day, which are beyond the scope of most individual Groups.

Another District function relates to the planning of future provision. The changing distribution of youngsters, or the development of new-build housing in the area, both lead to the need for a new Group where none existed before or one had closed.

Finally, we are very conscious of our relationship with our local authority Dacorum Borough Council. Firstly they are one of our Landlords (from whom four Groups lease their HQ site, and two more rent a Hall). Secondly they have been a useful source of advice and local knowledge. But mostly we are delighted that in 2012 the Mayor of the Borough graciously consented to be our President for the year. This is a significant recognition of the part played by Scouting in the local community, which we hope and trust will long continue.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the Hemel Hempstead District Scout Council

I report on the accounts of the District Scout Council for the year to 31st December 2012 which are set out on pages 3 to 7.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The District's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed. It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act.
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act, and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Report

My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
