It is fundamentally:

Designed for anyone from 'Scouts (must be over 11) to Adults' in the District.

Fun for all, no previous bushcraft experience required.

You need to have camped under canvas previously (with your own scout group).

Not requiring specialised equipment to take part as this is provided.

Allows you to try out something you have never done before and be more self sufficient.



Some of the many skills you may wish to try out:

Make a shelter from 'tarp' or natural materials and sleep in it.

Using a Knife, Axe and Saw in the Bushcraft way.

All you need to know about fires and starting them without a match.

Identifying and collecting wild foods.

Preparing and cooking animals and fish.

Making gadgets from natural materials.

How to collect and make safe drinking water.

Using and sleeping in a hammock

Opportunity for Scouts and Explorer Scouts to gain their Survival badge



All new members start as Year 1 and attend Level 1 Modules which covers the most essential skills, plus Saturdays and camps. Year 2 - for those who attended Level 1 previously. Year 3 - for all those ongoing after attending two or more years. Please note in your diary the 2019 dates, costs are for all sessions in the course.

New members start at Year 1 and only do Level 1 Modules 1, 2 & 3 plus two Saturday sessions and both camps.

Mondays 14th Jan (Module 1), 28th Jan (Module 2), 11th Feb (Module 3) 7.30 till 9.30 p.m.

Saturdays Practical 9th March and 23rd March, 10 a.m. till 4 p.m.

Camps - week end of 18th/19th May, Sat 10.00 a.m. till Sun 11.00 a.m.

also week end of 7th/8th Sept with an extra Monday (Module 7) planning session for campers on 2nd Sept Cost for the course is £45 details given with confirmation of registration.

Those who attended last year or returning from previous years

Year 2 - Mondays 21st Jan (Module 4) and 4th Feb (Module 5) 7.30 till 9.30 p.m. **also** both Saturdays and both camps as above. Cost for the course is **£45** details given with confirmation of registration.

Year 3 - Monday 25th Feb (Module 6), also both Saturdays and both camps as above.

Cost for the course is £40 details given with confirmation of registration.

Leatherwork sessions (optional for Year 2 & 3) Monday 4th March, 18th March and 1st April (one off cost of £12 per item made, payable on first session)
