Participate in the practical side of woodcraft and backwoods skills, camping without a tent. Work in own age groups; scouts, explorers, adults & leaders. Parents may join in too as long as they are DBS/CRB cleared by their Group Designed for anyone from 'Scouts (must be over 11) to Adults' in the District. Fun for all, no previous bushcraft experience required. You need to have camped under canvas previously (with your own scout group). Allows you to try out something you have never done before and be more self sufficient.

Some of the many skills you may wish to try out:

- Make a shelter from a 'tarp' or natural materials and sleep in it.
- Using a Knife, Axe and Saw in the Bushcraft way.
- All you need to know about fires and starting them without a match.
- Identifying and collecting wild foods.
- Preparing and cooking animals and fish.
- Making gadgets from natural materials.
- How to collect and make safe drinking water.
- Using and sleeping in a hammock
- Opportunity for Scouts and Explorer Scouts to gain their Survival badge



All new members start as Year 1 and attend Level 1 Modules which covers the most essential skills, plus Saturdays and camps. Year 2 - for those who attended Level 1 previously. Year 3 - for all those ongoing after attending two or more years.

 <u>New members</u> start at Year 1 and only do Level 1 Modules 1, 2 & 3 plus two Saturday sessions and both camps. Mondays 13th Jan (Module 1), 27th Jan (Module 2), 10th Feb (Module 3) all from 7.30 till 9.30 p.m.
<u>Saturdays</u> Practical 14th March and 28th March, from 10 a.m. till 4 p.m.
<u>Camps</u> - Week Ends of 6th/7th June, 5th/6th Sept, from Sat 10.00 a.m. till Sun 11.00 a.m.
also an additional preparation planning evening on WEDNESDAY 2nd Sept evening (Module 7)
