



### **Notes to the Accounts.**

1. £4,301.00 is held as a provision for the Warners End and Boxmoor buildings.
2. £3,000.00 is held as a provision for Scout Shop development.
3. £10,000.00 is held as the District Reserve.
4. £6,145.59 is held in the Adventure Fund.
5. £6,473.32 is held in the International Fund.
6. A 5 year loan of £2,400.00 to Two Waters was made in 2016 for the purchase of canoes. Repayments of £480.00 each were made in April 2017, May 2018 & May 2019. Owing to the lack of activity in 2020 the repayment schedule was extended by one year. The final two repayments were made in 2021.
7. While it has not been possible to quantify the exact profits made by the Shop in 2021 for a number of reasons, an interim payment of £1,500.00 was transferred to the District. Steps have been taken by the District, in conjunction with the Shop Team, to address the matter for the future.
8. The £3,000.00 deposit is still held by Lochearnhead. Steps are being taken to obtain its return to the District as it is not known when we will next be holding a camp there.



## Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the Hemel Hempstead District Scout Council

I report on the accounts of the District Scout Council for the year to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021 which are set out on pages 3 to 7.

### Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The District's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act,
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act, and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

### Basis of Independent Examiner's Report

My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
